The Power of Education Diminishing Our Voices: Is there Equality in Education?

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
Introduction and Purpose

- ❖ This chart depicts how difficult it was for employers to close their skills gap by filling their open positions in 2018 compared to 2017. 35% said they found it harder, 5% said it was easier, and 60% said they had the same difficulty (Gonzalez, 2017).
- ❖ It is necessary that both college and universities work alongside employers to see what skills they require so that they can teach those students in order for them to be prepared.

In Favor of College Degrees Opposed to College Degrees

- Employers believe that people with a college degree tend to be more smart, articulate, and productive.
- Companies use automated hiring tools on purpose to prevent applicants that have experience from applying because they lack a college degree.
- There is a lack of communication between colleges/universities and employers. New skills are being required every day, but college graduates aren't prepared.
- Employers are now open to hiring candidates who have alternative credentials in place of college degrees.

- ❖ A survey was conducted in June 2017 that collected data on Republicans and Democrats views on the impact colleges and universities have on the country. 58% of Republicans stated that colleges and universities have a negative impact, while 36% say their effect is positive (Fingerhut, 2017).
- Although both parties agreed that college does have an impact on them, there was a huge difference between their views of college overall.
